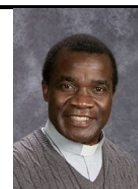

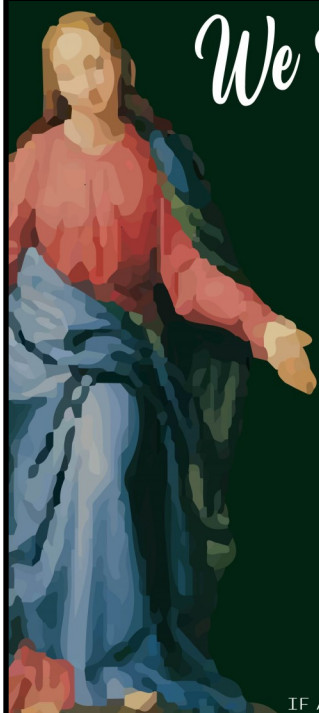

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

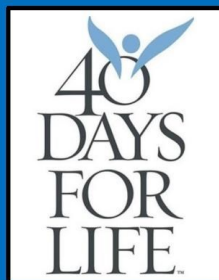
It's often said that the Catholic Church lays heavy rules on her members, rules that can almost seem impossible. Mass every Sunday? No lying ever? Sexual purity all the time? I recently said to some non-Catholic friends that more than fifty adults were baptized at my parish at the Easter Vigil. One responded spontaneously with shock, "Why would anyone do that?" In other words, why would someone willingly place themselves in a system with such demanding and rigorous rules?

Of course, no one in the history of religions is more demanding and rigorous than Jesus himself. In the Sermon on the Mount, he says you have to be holier than pharisees or you're out. He says if you call someone a fool, you go to fiery Gehenna. He says you can't even look at a woman with lust or you're guilty of adultery (which was punishable by death). To top it all off, he says you can't even get divorced and re-married. Doesn't he know these are basically impossible demands? What world is he living in?

The new one, actually. He is the new world. Jesus' words aren't meant to condemn. They are meant to signal something new, a restored humanity. Jesus doesn't just give external laws; he gives us his Holy Spirit to internalize the law through love. He wants to fill us with his love. That's what the Church exists to do. Love demands extraordinary things. The "demands" of the Church only make sense because she is filled with Jesus' love. That wildly demanding love is why we are Catholic.

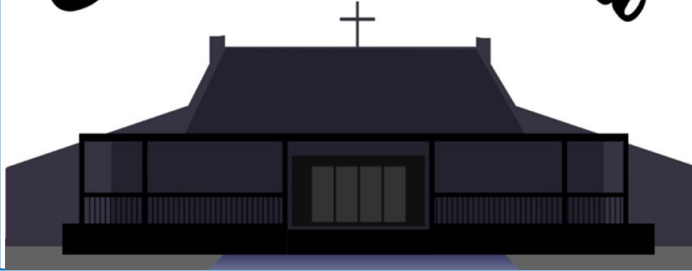
TAGALOG CORNER

From the Seminarian's Desk

Friends, on Corpus Christi Sunday, 2022, the U.S. Catholic bishops launched the National Eucharistic Revival. It is a three-year initiative with the mission and vision to inspire us to encounter Jesus in the consecrated bread and wine. It is an invitation to return to the source and summit of our faith in celebrating the Eucharist. This Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore our understanding and devotion to the great mystery in our country, the United States, thereby aiding us to renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. I believe this powerful initiative by our bishops comes at an opportune time. According to Pew Research Center, just one-third of U.S. Catholics believe that the Eucharist is Christ's true flesh and blood. This is alarming since the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" CCC, 1324. Aware of this reality, we kicked off the Eucharistic Revival in our parish on November 13, 2022. Banners were placed outside the church to generate awareness of this revival, stating: The Revival Has Begun! Last weekend, we did our Second Eucharistic procession in the streets. We began with the tradition of giving parishioners an icon of the true presence to take home after each Sunday mass. Talks and conferences about Eucharistic miracles have been offered, and we continually keep hearing homilies from our clergy addressing the importance of the Eucharist. Programs and information about this revival are available to us online and in person in our church. Our catechists also make us aware of this Eucharistic Revival in our parish. In addition, our chapel is open Wednesdays and Fridays for Eucharistic adoration.

One of my favorite books is titled *Transubstantiation, Transfinalization, Transignification* by Fr. Schillebeeckx. He writes that "the real eucharistic presence cannot be isolated from the real presence of Christ in the whole liturgical mystery and in the souls of the faithful." Brothers and sisters, the Eucharist is a person who reaches out to be in communion and relationship. In other words, the Eucharist is God who can be encountered or experienced. We cannot have an authentic relationship with a thing but most certainly with a person and God. Fr. Schillebeeckx says that in the Eucharist, Jesus "does not come just to sit enthroned in the sacred host... [He] comes in order that by means of this eucharistic presence he might live in our hearts, in our spirits, in our senses, and in our sanctified bodies." In this manner, Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is personal. We need to keep in mind that the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is a genuine mystery. Therefore, faith plays an essential role when knowledge and understanding are lacking. Many of our Catholic brothers and sisters have a hard time believing in the Eucharist as the true flesh and body of Christ because what they see is just bread and wine. We, too, see bread and wine. Yes, in the Holy Mass, bread and wine are distributed, but they have been consecrated to be the actual body and blood of Christ. Therefore, what is apportioned is natural bread and wine but what is received is the body and blood of Christ. He comes to you and me in this most humble state. Friends, Jesus does not benefit when we seek Him; we are the ones who benefit because He seeks and transforms us. We are the ones who need healing, and Jesus offers it to us when we open ourselves to encounter Him hidden in the Eucharistic species where his presence is truly present. In our first reading of today from the Book of Sirach, we are reminded of the precious God-given gift of free will. Let us then choose the Lord. You are part of our community, come and participate in any of our events. The Revival Has Begun!

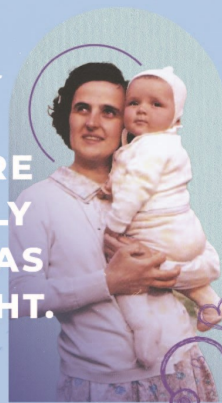

Eucharistic Miracle of DOUAI

FRANCE, 1254



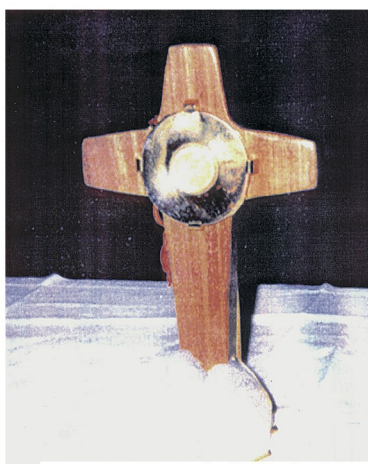
In the Eucharistic miracle of Douai, a consecrated Host was unintentionally dropped to the ground while a priest was distributing Communion to the faithful. Immediately he bent down to pick up the Holy Eucharist, but the Host lifted up in flight and lighted on the purificator. A little later, a wonderful Child appeared there, Who all the faithful and religious present in the celebration could contemplate. Although more than 800 years have elapsed, even today it is still possible to admire the Host of the miracle. All Thursdays of the month in the Church of Saint Peter of Douai, many faithful gather in prayer before the miraculous Host.

Bonum universale de Apibus is the work written by an eye witness of the miracle: the Dominican Father Thomas de Cantimpré, doctor of theology and “suffragan” Bishop of Cambrai. On the day of Easter in 1254 in the Church of St. Amato in Douai, a priest who was distributing Holy Communion unintentionally dropped a consecrated Host to the ground. Immediately he bent down to pick up the Sacred Species, but the Host lifted up in flight and lighted on the purificator. A little later, a wonderful Child appeared there Who all the faithful and religious present in the celebration could contemplate. The news spread quickly, and the Bishop of Cambrai, Thomas de Cantimpré, came immediately to Douai to verify the facts in person, which he described in this manner: “I went to the Dean of the Church, followed by many faithful, and

I asked to see the miracle. The Dean opened the small case in which he had reposed the Host of the miracle, but initially I didn't see anything special.

“I was conscious though, that nothing could prevent me from seeing, as was true of the others, the Sacred Body. I didn't even have time to ask myself this type of question, when I scarcely looked at the Host and saw the face of Christ crowned with thorns with two drops of Blood that descended on His forehead. Immediately I knelt, and crying, I began to thank God”. It is certain that already by the year 1356, that is, one century after the apparition, every year on Wednesday of Holy Week, a feast in memory of the miracle of the Blessed Sacrament was celebrated, and the document

which records it indicates that this event was in existence already for a long time. The precious relic of the miracle was conserved and honored until the Revolution. Then all signs of this marvel were lost for many years. In October 1854, the Pastor of the Church of St. Peter by chance discovered underneath the Christ in the Altar of the Dead, a small wooden box containing a small Host, still white, but with damaged edges. A letter written in Latin gives witness: “I, the undersigned, Canon of the distinguished collegial Church of St. Amato, certify it to be the real and true Host of the holy miracle, which I removed from imminent danger of profanation and which I have happily collected. I have placed the Host in this pyx and have left this witness, written by my own hand, for the faithful who will discover the Sacred Miracle in the future (January 5, 1793)”.
