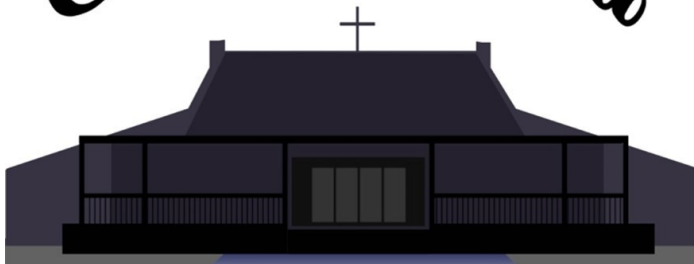

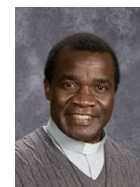

Arranging Our 'Catholic Furniture'

In our homes, we have basic 'furniture'. There is the dinner table, where we gather around as family, to give thanks and receive nourishment for our bodies. There is the television, which is a form of communication... albeit 'one-way'. We sit, look, and listen to entertainment, requiring very little activity on our part. And, let's not forget those 'Lazy-Boys', where a man can plop down and literally feel like the 'king' of his castle, and boy... no one else better be sitting in that 'chair' when he gets home from work!

Our Catholic churches also have similar furniture, but used for a 'different' purpose. They all have sacred furnishings. In every church, you will find: the altar, the ambo and the chair. Each of these represents Jesus Christ in its own, very unique way.

In every church, like our home, we have a 'table' where we gather for a meal. The altar represents Christ because it is where He becomes present to us in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. It is here, and only here, by the power of the Holy Spirit, and through the hands of our priest, that we are able to be present on Calvary. We are stepping out of time and into the exact moment of our salvation...at the foot of the cross. We join all believers in reaching out to Our Lord and He reaches back to us, offering to take away our sins.

When a church is dedicated, the altar is stripped bare and blessed by the bishop with sacred chrism. It is typically made of a durable solid material and it should always be positioned in the center of the sanctuary. Similar to our table at home, we come to give thanks. In this case, we are given His Body & Blood in the Eucharist, which is 'true' food and 'true' drink for our souls.

We also have the ambo (lectern) where God communicates with us. This is where His Word is proclaimed and He becomes present to us in Sacred Scripture. Unlike our television at home, we receive the messages and act upon them. The ambo normally compliments the altar, and is usually of the same design and material. It should only be used by: the lector/reader - to proclaim the readings; the cantor - to sing the Responsorial Psalm and Alleluia verse; the deacon or lector-- to recite the Prayers of the Faithful; and the priest or deacon -- to proclaim the Gospel and give the homily. Before the Gospel is proclaimed, the priest or deacon processes the Book of Gospels to the ambo. The altar servers lead the way with candles...surrounding the words of Jesus, which are about to be proclaimed. It is sacred and reserved for the Words that make God present in our assembly. The ambo should never be used to announce that "there are coffee and donuts being served in the hall", or "there's a black Toyota in the parking lot with its lights on."

Finally, we have the chair. The word comes from both the Greek and Latin "Cathedra." Like the 'Lazy-Boy', it is reserved for certain people. In ancient times, the chair was the sign of authority from where the bishops would teach. Back then, as today, each diocese had a Cathedral, where the chair or seat of the bishop is located. A diocese can also be referred to as a "see," taken from the Latin "sedes", meaning seat.

We would be considered the 'See' of San Bernardino and Rome is considered the 'Holy See'. When Bishop Rojas attends a bishop's conference, other bishops refer to him as "San Bernardino" and he refers to them by the name of their diocese, i.e.: "Las Vegas" or "Boston."

The chair reminds us that we are a church who is learning. We are faithful to the teachings of the "One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church". We, as Catholics, believe that this is the only moral authority that God has given to his people. The chair of Peter represents all that Christ passed on to his apostles. The chair here at St. Peter & St. Paul is linked to the chair of our Cathedral in San Bernardino, which in turn is linked to the Chair of Peter in Rome. This chair unites us with "the Lord, who has established His throne in heaven" (Ps 103:19a). It symbolizes the celebrant's authority to preside at the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It is where he is united with Christ, and is acting as His representative in union with the voice of the magisterium i.e. the pope and all of the bishops. It should always be treated with dignity and should never be used by anyone other than those to it has been appointed.

When the priest sits in the chair, we are seeing Christ's authority. His teachings come to us through the doctrines and traditions that were entrusted to Peter and the Apostles. They in turn, passed on that authority to others... generation after generation, and it continues to be passed down every time a bishop, in union with Rome, lays hands upon a newly ordained priest. The chair represents that 'unbroken chain' that links our priests with St. Peter, to whom our founder, Jesus Christ, appointed. (Matt 16:18)

And, the Catholic Church, (east and west), is the only Church that can make that statement.

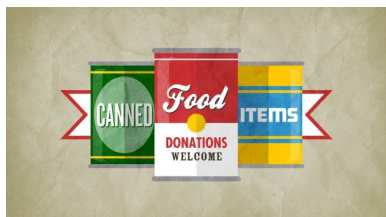

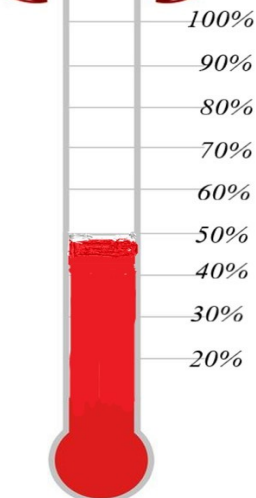

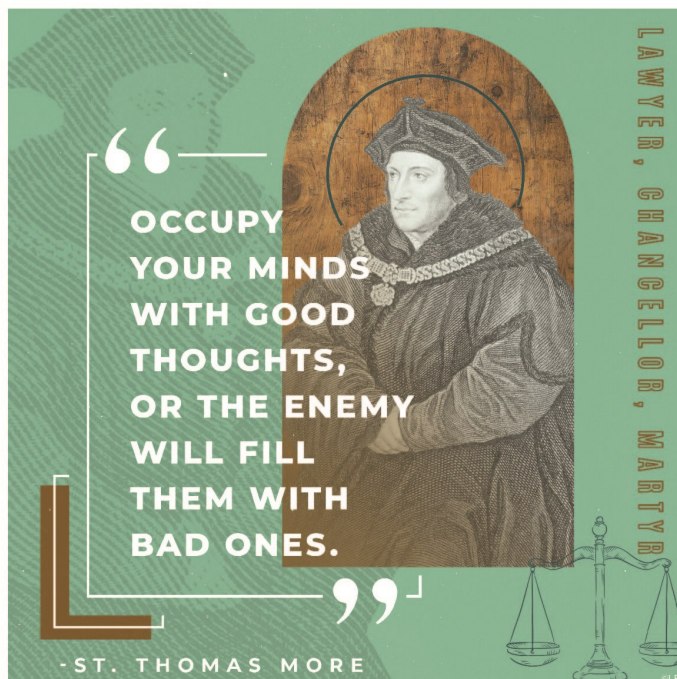

Eucharistic Miracle of BOXMEER

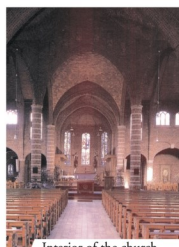
NETHERLANDS, 1400



During a Mass in Boxmeer, in Holland, in the year 1400, the species of wine was transformed into Blood and bubbled out of the chalice, splashing onto the corporal. The priest, terrorized at the sight, asked God to forgive his doubts, and the Blood immediately stopped bubbling out of the chalice. The Blood that had fallen on the corporal coagulated into a lump the size of a walnut. Even today one can see the Blood, which has not changed at all over time.

The Eucharistic miracle of Boxmeer took place in the church of Saints Peter and Paul in 1400. Father Arnoldus Groen was celebrating Mass and immediately after having consecrated the Eucharistic species, doubted the Real Presence of the Lord in the consecrated bread and the wine. Without warning, the consecrated wine, as though the Precious Blood were boiling, began bubbling out of the chalice and onto the corporal.

The wine was changed into Blood and coagulated in a great lump. The relics of the corporal and the Precious Blood are preserved to this day and the anniversary of the miracle is celebrated with an annual solemn procession. There are many documents that describe the miracle, as well as stone

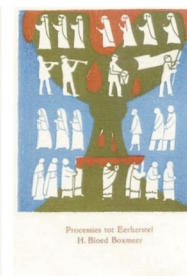
tablets and paintings. Popes Clement XI, Benedict XIV, Pius IX and Leo XIII all showed a particular devotion to the miracle.
