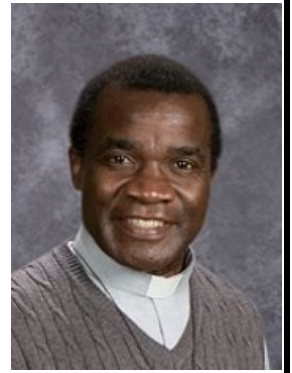

The Church and the Bible

Our Protestant brothers and sisters are very well versed when quoting scripture. Sometimes the Holy Bible can be used in an attempt to disprove *much* of what the Church teaches and believes. Contrary to popular belief, Catholics *do* believe that the bible is the inspired Word of God, revealed to men, so that we may attain wisdom and knowledge in matters of our faith.

The bible is a collection of books containing the Old Testament (Hebrew Scriptures) and New Testament (Gospels, Letters from Paul, etc.). The twenty-seven books of the New Testament were selected from many writings and books that were circulating around the early Church. It wasn't until the Church councils, held at Hippo (393 AD) and Carthage (397 AD), that the list was finalized and accepted by the entire Western Church. By the fifth century, the Syrian Church was the last to accept this same list as sacred scripture.

Throughout history, the guardian, caretaker, and interpreter of the bible has always been the Catholic Church, guided by the Holy Spirit. The Church that was responsible for selecting these inspired writings, is the *same* Church that has guarded and maintained the Sacred Traditions that parallel the Sacred Scriptures. Together, these are the 'pillars' on which our Church and our teachings stand. The Church archives possess most copies of surviving ancient manuscripts used for our bible that exist in the world today. The dedication of the monks, who diligently copied these manuscripts, is why we still have the written word available to us. The irony is, some of our separated brothers and sisters use the book that *we* gave them, and now attempt to use it *against* us.

During the sixteenth century, at the time of the Reformation, certain 'books' of scripture were brought in to question as to whether they were truly 'inspired' by God or not. Seven of these books of the Old Testament were removed from the bible, creating the version used by most Protestants today. They were still respected as good books to read, however, the Reformers felt they should not be part of the bible. Most Protestants still believe that the Catholic Church *added* these books to scripture. Yet, history can show that they were in use by the Universal Church until the Reformers formally *removed* them.

Admittedly, we as Catholics, can learn much from our Protestant brothers and sisters when it comes to reading and falling in love with the bible. Actually, Catholics are more *hearers* of the Word than they are *readers* of the Word. If a Catholic attends Mass everyday for three years, he/she will have the opportunity to hear most of the sacred scriptures. Our Holy Mass is loaded with scripture, not only in the readings, but also in the greetings and prayers. Just about every part of our ritual in the Holy Mass can be found in the Gospels, letters from Paul, the Acts of the Apostles, and the Book of Revelation.

From the Gloria to the "Hosanna's" in the "Holy, Holy, Holy", we are living and breathing scripture in our ritual worship of God.

One person can use the bible to *prove* a point of faith by quoting a certain chapter and verse, and another can use another chapter and verse to *disprove* the same point. It *can* become completely futile when arguing about scripture and what it actually means. This is why an authority figure was established by Christ to guide and direct His Church. One of the reasons Christ instituted the Church was for this purpose. The men He sent forth, to spread the Gospel message, did not have written scrolls or books with which to use in sharing God's Word.

They were inspired by the Holy Spirit to spread the 'good news' and share their faith. They had the Word of God, which was manifested by their faith in Jesus Christ, firmly entrenched in their hearts. Their entire life reflected this Word by their acts of faith, hope, and charity. When people listened to the early evangelists, they were not handed a book...they were offered a new way of life.

Many Christians, both Catholic and non-Catholic alike, fail to realize that the Catholic Church *is* the institution that originally presented the bible to the world. The Church is not a product of the bible... the bible is a product of the Church. One thing I recommend for *all* believers is to *not* argue about matters of faith, but to find common ground on which to agree. All discussion and dialogue should be carried out with charity and respect. After all, our singular common goal as believers is never to win arguments, but *always* to save souls.

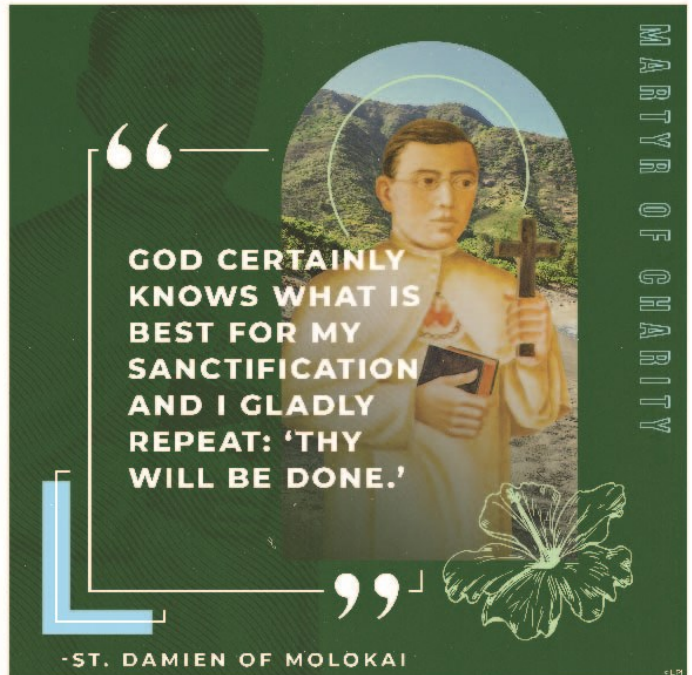

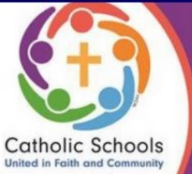
